## HIGHWAY CODE CHANGES

## Rule H1 - New Hierarchy of Road Users

- Drivers who can cause the greatest harm in the event of a collision bear the greatest responsibility to take care of other road users.
- This means drivers of commercial vehicles should look out for and provide a safe environment for all other road users.
- The bigger your vehicle the more responsible you are.

- Pedestrians
- 2 Cyclists
- 3 Horse riders
- 4 Motorcyclists
- 6 Cars/taxis
- 6 Vans/minibuses
- 7 HGVs and large PCVs


## Rule H2 - New priority for Pedestrians at Junctions

- Drivers, motorcyclists and cyclists should give way to pedestrians crossing or waiting to cross a road which you the driver is turning into.
- You should give way to pedestrians waiting to use a zebra crossing.



## Rule H3 - New priority for cyclists when cars are turning

- Drivers should not cut across cyclists, horse riders or horse drawn vehicles when turning into or out of a junction, or changing direction or changing lane
- Drivers should not turn at a junction if this would cause a cyclist, horse rider or horse drawn vehicle to swerve
